Instructions are written for 3 months. Changes for 6 months are in parentheses. (Shown in size 6 months.)

Knitted Measurements Chest 18 (21)"/45.5 (53.5)cm Length 15 (16¼)"/38 (41)cm (with shoulders and crotch buttoned)

Materials

- 2 (3) 1¾oz/50g hanks (each approx 136yd/125m) of Cascade Yarns 220 Superwash Sport (superwash merino wool) in #897 baby denim (MC)
- 1 hank each in #845 denim (A) and #871 white (B)
- One pair size 6 (4mm) needles or size to obtain gauge
- Size 6 (4mm) circular needle, 16"/40cm long
- Stitch holder
- Stitch markers
- Seven 7/16"/11mm buttons
- Sewing needle and light blue sewing thread



Note

Lower front and lower back are worked separately, then the body is worked in the round to underarms.

Onesie

FRONT

Beg at crotch, with straight needles and MC, cast on 19 (21) sts. Work in garter st (knit every row) for 4 rows, end with a WS row. **Next row (RS)** K3, pm, k13 (15), pm, k3. **Next row** K3, sl marker, p13 (15), sl marker, k3. Keeping 3 sts each side in garter st and rem sts in St st (k on RS, p on WS), cont as foll: **Next (inc) row (RS)** K3, sl marker, k1, M1, knit to 1 st before next marker, M1, k1, sl marker, k3. **Next row** K3, sl marker, purl to next marker, sl marker, k3. Rep last 2 rows 6 (7) times more—33 (37) sts.


LEGBANDS

Row 1 (RS) Cast on 7 (9) sts, knit to end, dropping markers, cast on 7 (9) sts—47 (55) sts. **Row 2** K10 (12), purl to last 10 (12) sts, k10 (12). **Row 3** Knit. **Row 4** Rep row 2. Place sts on holder.

BACK

Beg at crotch, with straight needles and MC, cast on 19 (21) sts. Work in garter st (knit every row) for 4 rows, end with a WS row. **Next row (RS)** K3, pm, k13 (15), pm, k3. **Next row** K3, sl marker, p13 (15), sl marker, k3. **Next (buttonhole) row (RS)** K3, sl marker, *k2tog, yo, k3 (4); rep from * once more, end k2tog, yo, k1, sl marker, k3. Keeping 3 sts each side in garter st and rem sts in St st, cont as foll:

Next (inc) row (RS) K3, sl marker, k1, M1, knit to 1 st before next marker, M1, k1, sl



Gauge

21 sts and 27 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using size 6 (4mm) needles. Take time to check gauge.

Instructions are written for newborn–3 months.

Knitted Measurements
Chest (closed) 20"/51cm
Length 20"/51cm

Materials

- 3 1³/4oz/50g hanks (each approx 136yd/125m) of Cascade Yarns 220 Superwash Sport (superwash merino wool) in #1946 silver grey (MC)
- 1 hank each in #897 baby denim (CC) or #894 strawberry cream (CC)
- One pair each sizes 5 and 6 (3.75 and 4mm) needles or size to obtain gauge
- Size 5 (3.75mm) circular needle, 29 "/74cm long
- Eight size 1 metal snap fasteners
- Sewing needle and sewing thread



Stitch Glossary
Inc 3 (on RS row) Work (k1, M1, k1)
in same stitch.
Inc 3 (on WS row) Work (p1, M1 p-st,

K1, P1 Rib (over a multiple of 2 sts plus 1) Row 1 (RS) K1, *p1, k1; rep from * to end. Row 2 P1, *k1, p1; rep from * to end. Rep rows 1 and 2 for k1, p1 rib.

Back

With larger needles and MC, cast on 38 sts. Purl next row. Beg with a knit row, cont in St st (k on RS, p on WS) as foll:

BOTTOM SHAPING

Cast on 5 sts at beg of next 2 rows, then 3 sts at beg of next 6 rows—66 sts. **Inc row (RS)** K1, M1, knit to last st, M1, k1—68 sts. Purl next row. Rep last 2 rows 8 times more, end with a WS row—84 sts. Work even until piece measures 5¾"/14.5cm from beg, end with a WS row.

SIDE SHAPING

Dec row (RS) K1, k2tog, knit to last 3 sts, ssk, k1—82 sts.

Rep dec row every 8th row 7 times more, then every 6th row 3 times—62 sts. Work even until piece measures 16"/40.5cm from beg, end with a WS row.

ARMHOLE SHAPING

Bind off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows. **Dec row (RS)** K1, k2tog, knit to last 3 sts, ssk, k1. Purl next row. Rep last 2 rows 4 times more—44 sts. Work even until armhole measures 31/2"/9cm, end with a WS row.

Gauge

25 sts and 33 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using larger needles. *Take time to check gauge*.





Sleeveless Lace Dress

With a stockinette stitch bodice and eyelet skirt, this little dress would look lovely on its own as a sundress or over a blouse or T-shirt.

Knitted Measurements Chest (closed) 17 (19, 21)"/43 (48, 53)cm

Length 141/2 (16, 18)"/37 (40.5, 46)cm

Materials

- 3 (4, 5) 1¾ oz/50g hanks (each approx 136yd/125m) of Cascade Yarns 220 Superwash Sport (superwash merino wool) in #826 tangerine
- Size 4 (3.5mm) circular needle, 16"/40cm long, or size to obtain gauge
- Size 5 (3.75mm) circular needle, 16"/40cm long, *or size to obtain gauge*
- Scrap yarn
- Stitch marker
- One 3/4"/19mm button
- Size E/4 (3.5mm) crochet hook
- 3/8"/10mm ribbon, 24"/61cm long

Lace Pattern

(multiple of 4 sts)

Rnd 1 Knit around.

Rnd 2 *Yo, ssk, p2; rep from * around.

Rnd 3 *K2, p2; rep from * around.

Rnd 4 *K2tog, yo, p2; rep from * around

Rnd 5 *K2, p2; rep from * around. Work rnds 2–5 for lace pattern.

Provisional Method Cast-on

Using scrap yarn and crochet hook, ch the number of sts to cast on plus a few extra. Cut a tail and pull the tail through the last chain. With knitting needle and yarn, pick up and knit the stated number of sts through the "purl bumps" on the back of the chain. To remove waste chain, when instructed, pull out the tail from the last crochet stitch. Gently and slowly pull on the tail to unravel the crochet stitches, carefully placing each released knit stitch on a needle.

Dress

SKIRT

Using provisional method and larger needle, cast on 100 (112, 124) sts. Place marker (pm) and join, being careful not to twist sts.

Next rnd Work rnd 1 of lace pat.

Cont in lace pat (rnds 2–5) until piece measures 8 (9, 10) "/20 (23, 25.5)cm from beg, end with a rnd 3 or 5. Bind off in pat.

BODICE

Carefully remove scrap yarn and place 100 (112, 124) sts on smaller needle. Pm and work in St st (k every rnd) for $2\frac{3}{4}(3, 3\frac{1}{2})$ "/7 (7.5, 9)cm.

DIVIDE FOR ARMHOLES

Next row (RS) K to last 7 sts, bind off 14 sts, removing marker, k until there are 36 (42, 48) sts on RH needle and place on st holder for front, bind off 14 sts, k to end of row for back. Turn to work back in St st rows.

BACK

Cont in St st (knit on RS, purl on WS), bind off 3 sts at beg next 2 rows—30 (36, 42) sts. Purl one row on WS.

Next (dec) row (RS) K2, ssk, work across to last 3 sts, k2tog, k2—28 (34, 40) sts.

Next row Work even. Rep last 2 rows once more—

26 (32, 38) sts. Work even until armhole measures

Vork even until armhole measures $2(2\frac{1}{2}, 3)$ "/5 (6.5, 7.5)cm, end with a WS row. Bind off.

Gauges

24 sts and 34 rnds to 4"/10cm over St st using size 4 (3.5mm) needle. 24 sts and 34 rnds to 4"/10cm over lace pattern using size 5 (3.75mm) needle. *Take time to check gauges*.



Hooded Onesie

Knitted Measurements Chest 21 (22, 23)"/53.5 (56, 58.5)cm Length 14 (15, 16)"/35.5 (38, 41)cm Upper Arm 7½ (8, 8½)"/19 (20.5, 21.5)cm

Materials

- 4 (5, 6) 1₃/₄oz/50g hanks (each approx 136yd/125m) of Cascade Yarns *220* Superwash Sport (superwash merino wool) in #845 denim (MC)
- 1 hank in #871 white (CC)
- One pair size 5 (3.75mm) needles or size to obtain gauge
- Cable needle
- Stitch holders
- Eight 1/2 "/13mm snaps
- 2" (5cm) pompom maker



Stitch Glossary

MB (Make Bobble) (K1, yo, k1) in same st, turn. P3, turn. K3, turn. P3, turn. K3tog—1 st.

4-st LPC Sl 2 sts to cable needle and hold in front, p2, k2 from cable needle.

4-st RPC Sl 2 sts to cable needle and hold in back, k2, p2 from cable needle.

K2, P2 Rib

Row 1 (RS) *K2, p2; rep from * across, end k2. **Row 2** *P2, k2; rep from *

across, end p2. Rep rows 1 and 2 for k2, p2 rib.

Seed Stitch

Row 1 (RS) *K1, p1; rep from * across. Row 2 Purl the knit sts and knit the purl sts as they appear. Rep row 2 for seed st.

Onesie

RIGHT SLEEVE With CC, cast on 32 sts.

Rows 1–13 Work in k2, p2 rib. Change to MC.

Row 14 (RS) Knit.

Row 15 Work 6 seed sts, p5, k12, p3, work 6 seed sts.

Row 16 Work 6 seed sts, work chart 1 over next 20 sts, work 6 seed sts. Keeping new sts each side in seed st, cont to follow chart in this way to row 28, then repeat rows 1–28 to end. AT THE SAME TIME, inc 1 st each end of row every 10 (8, 8) rows 3 (4, 5) times—38 (40, 42) sts. Work even until piece measures 6½ (7½ , 8)"/16.5 (19, 20.5)cm, ending with a WS row.

CAP SHAPING

Bind off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows—34 (36, 38) sts. Dec 1 st at each end of row

Gauge

20 sts and 28 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using size 5 (3.75mm) needles. Cable panel = $2\frac{3}{4}"/7$ cm wide using size 5 (3.75mm) needles. *Take time to check gauge*.





Lollipop Sweater

What could be sweeter than a pink pullover with a candy motif? The multicolored lollipops are crocheted separately, then sewn on.

Instructions are written for size 6 months. Changes for 12 and 18 months are in parentheses. (Shown in size 12 months.)

Finished Measurements Chest 21 (23, 25)"/53.5 (58.5, 63.5)cm Length 10½ (11½,12½)"/26.5 (29, 31.5)cm

Upper arm 8 (9, 10)"/20.5 (23, 25.5)cm

Materials

- 2 (3, 3) 1¾oz/50g hanks (each approx 136yd/125m) of Cascade Yarns 220 Superwash Sport (superwash merino wool) in #836 pink ice (B)
- 1 hank each in #901 cotton candy (A), #844 periwinkle (C) and #807 raspberry (D)
- One pair size 6 (4mm) needles *or size* to obtain gauge
- One set (5) size 6 (4mm) double-pointed needles (dpns)
- Size G/6 (4mm) crochet hook
- Stitch marker

Note

Sweater has rolled hems. To measure accurately, measure length from the bottom edge of the roll. Do not unroll the hem to measure.

Back

With A, cast on 60 (66, 70) sts. Work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) for 6 rows.

**Next row (RS) With B, *k1, p1; rep from * to end. Beg with a purl row, cont in St st using B for 5 rows, end with a WS row. Change to C and work in St st for 8 rows. Change to A and work in St st for 4 rows.

Next row (RS) With B, *p1, k1; rep from * to end. Beg with a purl row, cont in St st using B for 5 rows, end with a WS row. Change to C and work in St st for 8 rows. Change to A and work in St st for 4 rows.** Rep from ** to ** once more. Next row (RS) With B, *k1, p1; rep from * to end. Beg with a purl row, cont in St st using B only until piece measures 10½ (11½,12½)"/26.5 (29, 31.5)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

SHOULDER AND NECK SHAPING

Next row (RS) Bind off first 15 (18, 20)
sts, knit until there are 30 sts on RH
needle, place these 30 sts on holder for

back neck, bind off last 15 (18, 20) sts.

Front

With A, cast on 60 (66, 70) sts. Work in St st for 6 rows.

Next row (RS) With B, *k1, p1; rep from * to end. Beg with a purl row, cont in St st using B for 5 rows, end with a WS row. Change to C and work in St st for 8 rows. Change to A and work in St st for 4 rows. Next row (RS) With B, *p1, k1; rep from * to end. Beg with a purl row, cont in St st using B only until piece measures 9 (9½, 10)"/23 (24, 25.5)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

NECK SHAPING

Next row (RS) K18 (21, 23), place center 24 sts on holder for front neck, join a 2nd hank of B, k18 (21, 23). Working both sides at once, purl next row.

Next (dec) row (RS) With first hank of B, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1; with 2nd hank of B, k1, ssk, knit to end. Purl next row. Rep last 2 rows twice more—15 (18, 20) sts. Work even until piece measures same length as back to shoulder, end with a WS row. Bind off each side for shoulders. Sew shoulder seams. Place markers 4 (4½, 5)"/10 (11.5, 12.5)cm down from shoulders on back and front.

Gauge

22 sts and 30 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using size 6 (4mm) needles. *Take time to check gauge.*





Lined Blanket

Adding a fabric lining and quilt batting to a simple knit blanket transforms it into something extra-special and extra-warm. "Whoo" wouldn't love that?

Knitted Measurements Approx 30" x 30"/76cm x 76cm

Materials

- 8 1³/4oz/50g hanks (each approx 136yd/125m) of Cascade Yarns 220 Superwash Sport (superwash merino wool) in #802 green apple
- Size 6 (4mm) circular needle, 36"/91cm long *or size to obtain gauge*
- Size E/4 (3.5mm) crochet hook
- 1 yd/1m lightweight cotton fabric
- 1 yd/1m low-loft fusible batting
- Sewing needle and sewing thread

Blanket

Cast on 183 sts.

Row 1 (RS) Knit.

Row 2 K1, purl to last st, end k1.

Row 3 K1, *[p1, k1] 5 times, p10; rep from * to last 2 sts, end p1, k1.

Row 4 K2, *k10, [p1, k1] 5 times;

rep from * to last st, end k1.

Row 5 K1, *p1, [p1, k1] 4 times, p2, k9; rep from * to last 2 sts, end p1, k1.

Row 6 K2, *p9, k1, [k1, p1] 4 times, k2;

rep from * to last st, end k1.

Rows 7–22 Rep rows 3–6 four times more. **Rows 23 and 25** Knit.



Rows 24 and 26 K1, purl to last st, end k1.

Row 27 K1, *p11, [k1, p1] 4 times, k1; rep from * to last 2 sts, end p1, k1.
Row 28 K2, *[p1, k1] 4 times, p1, k11; rep from * to last st, end k1.

Row 29 K1, *p1, k9, p1, [p1, k1] 4 times, p1; rep from * to last 2 sts, end p1, k1. **Row 30** K2, *k1, [p1, k1] 4 times, k1, p9, k1; rep from * to last st, end k1.

Rows 31–46 Rep rows 27–30 four times more.

Row 47 Knit.

Row 48 K1, purl to last st, end k1. Rep rows 1–48 four times more, then rows 1–24 once. Bind off all sts loosely knitwise. Piece should measure approximately 30"/76cm from beg.

Finishing

Block piece lightly to measurements.

EDGING

With RS facing and crochet hook, join yarn with a sl st in any corner.

Rnd 1 (RS) Ch 1, making sure that work lies flat, sc evenly around entire edge, working 3 sc in each corner, join rnd with a sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

HNING

Cut one 36"x 36"/91.5cm x 91.5cm square each of cotton fabric and batting. Fuse batting to WS of cotton fabric following package directions. Place lining/batting, batting side up, on work surface. Place WS of blanket on top of batting. Center blanket carefully and pin around the perimeter, working from the center out along each edge. Trim lining/batting so it's 1/2" /1.3cm wider all around than blanket. Remove pins. Fold each edge of lining/batting 1/2"/1.3cm to WS and press. Place blanket WS up on work surface. Place lining/batting, lining side up, on top of blanket. Center lining/batting carefully and pin in place, working from the center out along each edge. Butting edge of lining to bottom edge of sc edging, slipstitch lining to blanket.

Gauge

24 sts and 34 rows to 4"/10cm over pat st using size 6 (4mm) circular needle. Take time to check gauge.





Materials

- 5 1³/4oz/50g hanks (each approx 136yd/125m) of Cascade Yarns 220 Superwash Sport (superwash merino wool) in #1914 alaska sky (A)
- 1 hank each in #802 green apple (B), #826 tangerine (C), and #817 aran (D)
- Size 5 (3.75mm) circular needle, 36"/91cm long, or size to obtain gauge
- One pair size 5 (3.75mm) needles
- Size G/6 (4mm) crochet hook
- Bobbins
- Two 3/8"/10mm 4-holed white buttons
- Sewing needle and green sewing thread
- Small amount of polyester fiberfill (for stuffing head)
- 1½ "/4cm pompom maker



Notes

- 1) Blanket is worked counting rows. Therefore, row gauge must be achieved for best results
- 2) You must keep track of rows as you go. Using ruled paper, write down rows 1–226, using a separate line for each number. Check off each row as you work it.
- 3) Rows for chart pats are numbered (1–20 for chart 1, 1–54 for chart 2 and 1–21 for chart 3). These numbered rows are for following the charts only. They

do not correspond to numbered rows for the blanket.

4) Work charts and borders using intarsia technique, using a separate bobbin of color for each color section.

- 1 hank each in #893 ruby (A), #841 moss (B), #813 blue velvet (C), #897 baby denim (D), and #854 navy (E)
- One pair size 4 (3.5mm) needles or size to obtain gauge
- Stitch holder
- Six ½"/13mm buttons

Note

Work edge sts in St st (k on RS, p on WS) in same color as nearest st on chart

Cardigan

BACK

With A, cast on 77 sts.

Rows 1-4 Knit.

Row 5 (RS) K9, M1, [k15, M1] 4 times, k8-82 sts.

Row 6 Purl.

Rows 7–13 Work edge st, work border chart 1 to last st, work edge st.

Row 14 With A, purl.

Row 15 K5, M1, [k8, M1] 9 times, k5—92 sts

Row 16 Purl.

Rows 17–31 Work edge st, work dump truck chart to last st, work edge st.

Row 32 With A, purl.

Row 33 K5, k2tog, [k7, k2tog] 9 times, k4—82 sts

Row 34 Purl.

Rows 35-41 Work edge st, work border chart 2 to last st, work edge st.

Row 42 With A, purl.

Row 43 K7, k2tog, k14, k2tog, k15, k2tog, k14, k2tog, k15, k2tog, k7—77 sts.

Row 44 With MC, purl.

With MC, work even in St st until piece measures 11"/28cm from beg, ending with a WS row

NECK AND SHOULDER SHAPING

Next row (RS) Bind off 24 sts, k29 and place on holder for back neck, bind off to end.

LEFT FRONT

With A, cast on 38 sts.

Rows 1-4 Knit.

Row 5 (RS) K7, M1, [k12, M1] 2 times, k7-41 sts.

Row 6 Purl

Rows 7–13 Work border chart 1,

working first st on RS rows and last st on WS rows as edge st.

Row 14 With A, purl.

Row 15 K7, M1, [k8, M1] 3 times, k9, M1. k1—46 sts.

Row 16 Purl.

Rows 17–31 Work dump truck chart, working first st on RS rows and last st on WS rows as edge st.

Row 32 With A, purl.

Row 33 K4, k2tog, [k7, k2tog] 4 times, k4—41 sts.

Gauge

28 sts and 32 rows to 4"/10cm over dump truck pattern using size 4 (3.5mm) needles. 26 sts and 36 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using size 4 (3.5mm) needles. Take time to check gauge.
