

Crochet pattern No 1720





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Introduction

I would like to thank you, for choosing to purchase this pattern. I hope that you will be fully satisfied with it and, above all, that the effect of your work will be exactly as you imagined. Remember that if you have any questions you can email me: krawka.blog@gmail.com.

Finished crochet pegasus is almost 30 cm (11.8 inches) long with tail. He is inspired by the baby pegasus from Disney's Hercules. Zeus described him as a magnificent horse with the brain of a bird:D Actually our crochet horsie will not have any brain at all - only stuffing, in his little head, but who cares when he is looking so cute and cuddly:)

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Materials

List of all the materials you will need for this project:

- yarn (I use 55% cotton yarn which measures 174 yards (159 meters) for 50 g, weight Sport / 5 ply (12 wpi), Gauge 24 to 30 st is 4 inches (10 cm)
 You can use any colors you like , but here is the list of colors I used:
 - o white we will call it white but it's not pure it's more pearl color base color
 - o light grey hoofs
 - o light blue eyes
 - o blue mane, tail

If you want to know more about the yarns or colors I chose, send me an email.

- 3,0 mm (D) hook,
- a piece of black and white felt for pupils, reflections and eyebrows
- cotton wool or other stuffing
- needle, thread, pins, scissors, etc.

R5: * sc 3, inc * X6 (30)

R6: * sc 2, inc * X10 (40)

R7: * sc 3, inc * X10 (50)

R8 - R9: sc around (50)

R10: * sc 4, inc * X10 (60)

R11 - R21: sc around (60)

R22: * sc 4, dec * X10 (50)

R23: sc around (50)

R24: * sc 3, dec * X10 (40)

R25: * sc 2, dec * X10 (30)

R26: sc around (30)

R27: * sc 3, dec * X6 (24)

STUFF

R28: sc around (24)

R29: * sc 2, dec * X6 (18)

R30: * sc, dec * X6 (12)

white yarn

R1: 13 ch (13)

R2: sc 12 on one side of chain, sc 12 on other (24)

R3: * inc, sc 3 * X6 (30)

R4: * inc, sc 2 * X10 (40)

R5: sc around (40)

R6: * inc, sc 3 * X10 (50)

R7 - R17: sc around (50)

R18: * sc 8, dec * X5 (45)

R19: * sc 7, dec * X5 (40)

R20 - R23: sc around (40)

R24: * sc 6, dec * X5 (35)

R25: * sc 5, dec * X5 (30)

R26: * sc 3, dec * X6 (24)

STUFF the body firmly now.











Eye (Make 2)

light blue yarn

R1: 6 sc in MR (6)

R2: * 3scin1, inc, sc *X2 (12)


R3: sc, inc 3, sc 3, inc 3, sc 2 (18)

R4: * sc 2, inc * X6 (24)

R5: * sc 3, inc * X6 (30) FO

From black felt cut two large circles for pupils and two white circles for light reflections.

R3: * sc 3, inc * X3 (15)

R4 - R5: sc 15 (15)

R6: * sc 4, inc * X3 (18)

R7: sc around (18)


Nostril (Make 2)

TURN after each row here

R1: 6 ch (6)

R2: sc 5 (5)

R3: dec, sc, dec (3) FO



Ear (Make 2)

white yarn

R1: 10 ch, ss in 1st ch to make a circle (10)

R2: sc 10 (10)

R3: * sc 4, inc * X2 (12)

R4: * sc 5, inc * X2 (14)

R5 - R6: sc around (14)

R7: * dec, sc 5 * X2 (12)

R8: * dec, sc 4 * X2 (10)

R9: * dec, sc 3 * X2 (8)

R10: skip 1, sc, skip 1, ss FO









Mane (Make 1)

blue yarn

R1: 6 sc in MR (6)

R2: inc around (12)

R3: * inc, sc 5 * X2 (14)

R4: * inc, sc 6 * X2 (16)

R5: * inc, sc 7 * X2 (18)

R6 - R29: sc around (18)

STUFF a bit now

R30: * dec, sc 7 * X2 (16)

R31: * dec, sc 6 * X2 (14)

R32: * dec, sc 5 * X2 (12)

STUFF some more

R33: * dec, sc 4 * X2 (10)

R34: * dec, sc 3 * X2 (8)

R35: * dec, sc 2 * X2 (6)

Back leg (Make 2)

start with light grey

R1: 6 sc in MR (6)

R2: inc around (12)

R3: *inc, sc 3* X2, inc, sc 2, ss (15)

R4: BLO sc 15 (15)

R5 - R6: sc 15 (15)

R7: *inc, sc 4 * X2, inc, sc 3, ss (18) FO grey

change to white yarn

R8: BLO ss 18 (18)


R9: BLO sc 18 (18)

R10: * sc 2, inc * X6 (24)

R11: sc 24 (24)

R12: * sc 3, inc * X6 (30)

R13: sc 30 (30) FO







Front leg (Make 2)

start with light grey

R1: 6 sc in MR (6)

R2: inc around (12)

R3: *inc, sc 3* X2, inc, sc 2, ss (15)

R4: BLO sc 15 (15)

R5 - R6: sc 15 (15)

R7: *inc, sc 4 * X2, inc, sc 3, ss (18) FO grey

change to white yarn

R8: BLO ss 18 (18)

R9: BLO sc 18 (18)


R10: * sc 5, inc * X3 (21)

R11 - R12: sc 21 (21)

R13: * sc 6, inc * X3 (24)

R14 - R16: sc 24 (24)

R17: sc 24 (24) FO







Wing base (Make 2)

white yarn

R1: 6 ch (6)

R2: sc 5 on one side of chain, sc 5 on other (10)

R3 - R5: sc 10 (10)

R6: * dec, sc 3 * X2 (8)

R7 - R10: sc 8 (8)

R11: dec, sc 6 (7)

R12: sc 7 (7)

R13: dec, sc 5 (6)

R14: sc 6 (6)

R15: sc 6 (6) FO



For each wing base we will add 3 wing ends: L (large), M (medium) and S (small) - make 2 of each for 2 wings.

Wing end L (Make 2)

white yarn

R1: 6 sc in MR (6)

R2: inc around (12)

R3: sc 12 (12)

R4:* dec, sc 4 * X2 (10)

R5: sc 10 (10) FO

Wing end M (Make 2)

white yarn

R1: sc 8 in MR (8)

R2: sc 8 (8)

R3: dec, sc 6 (7) FO

Wing end S (Make 2)

white yarn

R1: 6 sc in MR (6)

R2: sc 6 (6)

R3: sc 6 (6) FO

Tail (Make 1)

blue yarn

R1: 8 ch, ss in 1st to make a circle (8)

R2: sc 8 (8)

R3: * inc, sc 3 * X2 (10)

R4: * inc, sc 4 * X2 (12)

R5: * inc, sc 5 * X2 (14)

R6: * inc, sc 6 * X2 (16)

R7 - R9: sc 16 (16)

R10: *dec, sc 6 * X2 (14)

R11: * dec, sc 5 * X2 (12)

R12: * dec, sc 4 * X2 (10)

STUFF a bit

R13: * dec, sc 3 * X2 (8)

R14: * dec, sc 2 * X2 (6)

R15: dec 3 (3)

R16: skip 1, sc FO



Let's sew them together.

Firstly take nostrils and sew them to the muzzle shaping them in half circles

(see the photo for reference)

Stuff the muzzle.









Sew the muzzle to the head.



Side view of the head with muzzle.



Sew the white reflections to the pupils - bigger circle higher, smaller one lower.

Now sew the finished pupils to the eye - remember to make the second eye reflection of the first.



Sew eyes on both sides of muzzle.



Side view of the head with eyes.



Now sew the eyebrow above each eye.

We will leave the head for now.



Stuff the back legs very very lightly



Stuff the body if you haven't done it before.

Place the back leg on the upper closed corner of the body and sew it around - we stuffed the leg lightly because the corner is going a bit inside stuffing it more.



Place and sew the second back leg.



Sew the head to the body now, closing the hole in the body, before sewing the last gap stuff more if needed.



Bottom view of the head.



Stuff the front legs.



Place and sew the front legs. (see the photo for reference)



Side view.



Place the mane on top of the head - the mane should start on top of the head and end on the body.

(see the photo for reference)



Sew the mane very carefully around.



Now place the ears on each side of the mane on top of the head.



Sew the ears.



Back view of the ears.



Stuff the tail some more if needed.



Place the tail a bit higher than the back legs and sew it to the body.



Put the body that it's open part will be on the left, place the Large wing end in the bottom left corner of the base and sew it firmly. (do not stuff any part of the wing)



(see the photo for reference)



On the right from the previous end place the medium part and sew it.



Now place the smallest wing end and sew it.



Place the wing on the horse back next to the mane end - remember the wing ends should be directed down to the tail.

Sew both wings in their upper part where they are attached to the body.



Congratulations! Pegasus is finished and looking cuuute! Are you happy with the end result?
