Meet the utterly adorable TUBINGTON CHICKEN FAMILY, which consists of a rooster, a hen, a chick and a tiny baby chick. All in pretty fall colors! They are so quick and easy to make; you'll find yourself churning out many of these little creatures in no time.

#### **FINISHED SIZE**

Rooster: ~ 4" / 10 cm tall x 3.5" / 9 cm wide Hen: ~ 3.5" / 9 cm tall x 3.5" / 9 cm wide Chick: ~ 2.5" / 6 cm tall x 3" / 7.5 cm wide Baby chick: ~ 2" / 5 cm tall x 2.5" / 6 cm wide

#### HOOK

Crochet hook G / 4 mm / Japanese size 7/0

#### MATERIALS

Polyester filling Tapestry needle Black beads, sewing thread and needle Stitch marker (optional)

#### YARN

One skein <u>each</u> of Drops *Nepal* (65% wool, 35% alpaca; 50 g / 75 m; aran) in the following colors: Beige mix 0300 (beige) Medium brown mix 0612 (brown) Orange mix 2920 (orange) Golden rod 2923 (yellow) <u>Or</u> any aran weight yarn in the same or your preferred colors

GAUGE Not crucial

#### NOTE

- Be safe. Embroider eyes with brown yarn (or yellow yarn for rooster) if the toys are for small children.
- These are only suggestions. Feel free to use a small piece of felt for beaks and experiment with color combinations.
- Enough yarn for two sets of this family. These four skeins of Drops Nepal should be enough to
  make two sets of TUBINGTON CHICKEN FAMILY (one rooster, one hen, one chick and one baby chick
  per set) as well as one TUBINGTON OWL #1 and one TUBINGTON OWL #2 (in a separate set of
  patterns). However, results may vary, depending on your gauge and color combinations. Try omitting a row
  of rooster or hen body if you feel you are running out of yarn.

#### ABBREVIATIONS

ch: chain
dec: single crochet decrease
sc: single crochet (US Term)
ss: slip stitch
st(s): stitch(es)

#### **TIPS ON CROCHETING AROUND**

You can either:

1. Start each round with ch 1 (not counted as a stitch) and end each round with a ss into the first sc, or

2. Mark the first stitch of the round with a stitch marker, work the round and move the stitch marker up as you start the new round. At the end of last round, ss into the first sc of the previous round.

1. Follow the pattern for the comb, leaving two tail ends.



2. Repeat with the other tail end.



## How to make a wattle:

With orange yarn, ch 5, 1 sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, sc 3. (4 sts) Repeat one more time. (4 sts) Fasten off. Sew to the body below the beak.



2. Insert one tail end inside with a tapestry needle.



4. Tie the two ends together inside.



Make two sets of the TUBINGTON CHICKEN FAMILY from the four skeins of yarns



## **TUBINGTON ROOSTER**





## **DIRECTIONS FOR ROOSTER**

#### **Body:**

With brown yarn, ch 2.

**Round 1**: 6 sc into  $2^{nd}$  ch from hook. (6 sts) **Round 2**: 2 sc in each sc of previous round. (12 sts) **Round 3**: (Sc 1, 2 sc in the next sc) 6 times. (18 sts) **Round 4**: (Sc 2, 2 sc in the next sc) 6 times. (24 sts) **Round 5**: (Sc 3, 2 sc in the next sc) 6 times. (30 sts) **Round 6**: 1 sc in the back loop\* of each sc. (30 sts)

**Round 7-19** (or until the piece measures about 3" from the ridge of Round 6): 1 sc in each sc around. (30 sts) Do not fasten off.

Flatten the top front and back edges together and sc across the first 4-5 pairs of sts to help you see where to put the eyes, beak and comb.

## Comb:

With orange yarn, ch 4, 1 sc into the  $2^{nd}$  ch from hook, sc 2. (3 sts)

Ss into the 3<sup>rd</sup> top seam sc from corner.

Ch 5, 1 sc into the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, sc 3. (4 sts)

Ss into the 2<sup>nd</sup> top seam sc from corner.

Ch 4, 1 sc into the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, sc 2. (3 sts) Ss into the corner sc of top seam. Fasten off.

Thread each yarn tail into a tapestry needle and tie the ends into a knot inside. (See photos on p. 3.)

## Beak:

With yellow yarn, ch 3.

**Row 1**: 1 sc into 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, sc 1. Turn. (2 sts) **Row 2**: Ch 1, dec 1. (1 sts)

Fasten off. Sew to the body close to the top corner.

## Wattle:

With orange yarn, ch 5, 1 sc in  $2^{nd}$  ch from hook, sc 3. (4 sts)

Repeat one more time. (4 sts) (See photo on p. 3.) Fasten off. Sew to the body below the beak.

## Wing (make 2):

With brown yarn, ch 2.

**Row 1**: 1 sc into 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, sc 2. Turn. (3 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc. Turn. (6 sts)

**Row 3**: Ch 1, (sc 1, 2 sc in the next sc) 3 times. Turn (9 sts)

Row 4: Ch 1, (sc 2, 2 sc in the next sc) 3 times. (12 sts)

Fasten off, leaving a long tail to sew to body. (For the second rooster, use yellow yarn from Rows 1-3, fasten off and attach brown yarn for Row 4.)

## **Finishing:**

Using the photos as guide, attach (or embroider) the eyes. Stuff with polyester fill. Continue sc across the top edges to close the seam. Fasten off. (15 sts) Sew wings to body. Weave in ends. Attach a tassel tail as follows:

## Tail:

Cut two 8" lengths of yarn for each color. Hold one strand of each color together (4 strands total) and fold them in half to make a loop. Insert the crochet hook in the tail corner of the rooster to grab the loop and pull it through about half way. Pull all the strands through loop and pull tight to make a tassel. Repeat one more time at the stitch next to the corner. Trim the ends into shape.

## **TUBINGTON HEN**





## **Body:**

With beige yarn, ch 2.

**Round 1**: 6 sc into 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook. (6 sts)

Round 2: 2 sc in each sc of previous round. (12 sts)

**Round 3**: (Sc 1, 2 sc in the next sc) 6 times. (18 sts) **Round 4**: (Sc 2, 2 sc in the next sc) 6 times. (24 sts)

**Round 5**: (Sc 3, 2 sc in the next sc) 6 times. (24 sts)

**Round 6**: 1 sc in the back loop\* of each sc. (30 sts)

**Round 7-18** (or until the piece measures almost 3" from the ridge of Round 6): 1 sc in each sc around. (30 sts) Do not fasten off.

Flatten the top front and back edges together and sc across the first 4-5 pairs of sts to help you see where to put the eyes, beak and comb.

## Comb:

With orange yarn, ch 4, 1 sc into the  $2^{nd}$  ch from hook, sc 2. (3 sts)

Ss into the 3<sup>rd</sup> top seam sc from corner.

Ch 5, 1 sc into the  $2^{nd}$  ch from hook, sc 3. (4 sts) Ss into the  $2^{nd}$  top seam sc from corner.

Ch 4, 1 sc into the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, sc 2. (3 sts) Ss into the corner sc of top seam. Fasten off.

Thread each yarn tail into a tapestry needle and tie the ends into a knot inside. (See photos on p. 3.)



## Beak:

With yellow yarn, ch 3.

**Row 1**: 1 sc into 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, sc 1. Turn. (2 sts) **Row 2**: Ch 1, dec 1. (1 sts)

Fasten off. Sew to the body close to the top corner.

## Wing (make 2):

With brown yarn, ch 2.

**Row 1**: 1 sc into 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, sc 2. Turn. (3 sts) **Row 2**: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc. Turn. (6 sts) (Fasten off here and attach yellow yarn, if you'd like to switch color.)

**Row 3**: Ch 1, (sc 1, 2 sc in the next sc) 3 times. Turn (9 sts)

**Row 4**: Ch 1, (sc 2, 2 sc in the next sc) 3 times. (12 sts)

Fasten off, leaving a long tail to sew to body.

#### **Finishing:**

Using the photos as guide, attach (or embroider) the eyes. Stuff with polyester fill. Continue sc across the top edges to close the seam. Fasten off. (15 sts) Sew wings to body. Weave in ends.

## **Color variations**

For the second hen, I used orange yarn for the body, brown yarn for the wattle, and beige yarn for the first three rows of wings and orange yarn for the last row.

## **TUBINGTON CHICK**



#### **DIRECTIONS FOR CHICK**

#### **Body:**

With yellow yarn, ch 2.

**Round 1**: 6 sc into 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook. (6 sts)

Round 2: 2 sc in each sc of previous round. (12 sts)
Round 3: (Sc 1, 2 sc in the next sc) 6 times. (18 sts)
Round 4: (Sc 2, 2 sc in the next sc) 6 times. (24 sts)
Round 5: 1 sc in the back loop\* of each sc. (24 sts)
Round 6-12 (or until the piece measures about 2" from the ridge of Round 5): 1 sc in each sc around. (24 sts) Do not fasten off.

Flatten the top front and back edges together and sc across the first 4-5 pairs of sts to help you see where to put the eyes, beak and comb.

## Comb:

With orange yarn, ch 3, 1 sc into the  $2^{nd}$  ch from hook, sc 1. (2 sts)

Ss into the 3<sup>rd</sup> top seam sc from corner.

Ch 4, 1 sc into the  $2^{nd}$  ch from hook, sc 2. (3 sts)

Ss into the 2<sup>nd</sup> top seam sc from corner.

Ch 3, 1 sc into the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, sc 1. (2 sts) Ss into the corner sc of top seam. Fasten off.

Thread each yarn tail into a tapestry needle and tie the ends into a knot inside. (See photos on p. 3.)

## Beak:

With orange yarn, ch 3, **Row 1**: 1 sc into  $2^{nd}$  ch from hook, sc 1. Turn. (2 sts) **Row 2**: Ch 1, dec 1. (1 sts)

Fasten off. Sew to the body close to the top corner.

## Wing (make 2):

With yellow yarn, ch 2. **Row 1**: 1 sc into 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, sc 2. Turn. (3 sts) **Row 2**: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc. Turn. (6 sts)

**Row 3**: Ch 1, (sc 1, 2 sc in the next sc) 3 times. Turn. (9 sts)

Fasten off, leaving a long tail to sew to body.

## Finishing:

Using the photos as guide, attach (or embroider) the eyes. Stuff with polyester fill. Continue sc across the top edges to close the seam. Fasten off. (12 sts) Sew wings to body. Weave in ends.

# **TUBINGTON BABY CHICK**



## **DIRECTIONS FOR BABY CHICK**

#### **Body:**

With yellow yarn, ch 2.

Round 1: 6 sc into 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook. (6 sts)

**Round 2**: 2 sc in each sc of previous round. (12 sts) **Round 3**: (Sc 1, 2 sc in the next sc) 6 times. (18 sts) **Round 4**: 1 <u>sc in the back loop</u>\* of each sc. (18 sts) **Round 5-9**: 1 sc in each sc around. (18 sts) Do not fasten off.

Flatten the top front and back edges together and sc across the first 4-5 pairs of sts to help you see where to put the eyes, beak and comb.

#### Comb:

With orange yarn, ch 2, 1 sc into the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook. (1 sts)

Ss into the 3<sup>rd</sup> top seam sc from corner.

Ch 3, 1 sc into the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, sc 1. (2 sts)

Ss into the 2<sup>nd</sup> top seam sc from corner.

Ch 2, 1 sc into the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook. (1 sts)

Ss into the corner sc of top seam. Fasten off.

Thread each yarn tail into a tapestry needle and tie the ends into a knot inside. (See photos on p. 3.)

#### Beak:

Using the photos as guide, embroider a small beak with orange yarn.

## Wing (make 2):

With yellow yarn, ch 2. **Row 1**: 1 sc into 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, sc 2. Turn. (3 sts) **Row 2**: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc. (6 sts)

Fasten off, leaving a long tail to sew to body.

#### **Finishing:**

Using the photos as guide, attach (or embroider) the eyes. Stuff with polyester fill. Continue sc across the top edges to close the seam. Fasten off. (9 sts) Weave in ends.
